On-screen scenes show pages from the book "Moscow and Muscovites" by Gilyarovsky, followed by the movie "Jersey Boys".

The artist Chaparro speaks his text against the background of his paintings.

Toward the end of the page show, the film and the reading of the text, there is a growing noise in the hall.

Down the aisles of the hall go hand in hand the boys from Rossotrudnichestvo and the Jersey Boys from USAID, together with the ambassadors of Russia and America.

Let's specify: these are Russia's ambassadors to the countries of world, and American ambassadors to the countries of post-Soviet space, including Russia.

Narrator's voice utters these words.

On the stage, groups of performers dance the dance from the Jersey Boys movie, final scene. Well, oddly enough, the tune that sounds is "the Internationale" celebrating the hegemonic position of the guys out of here and the guys out of there. The name of the performance is "Putin-terror". Then they leave the stage, go to the gym, filling up all the aisles of the hall. They stop. A rope descends from the ceiling down to each one, and all the participants rise, either by the muscular exertion of their own arms and legs, through a mechanical pull of the rope, depending on the physical state of each participant. After rising to the ceiling, they leave the room via ceiling planks.

The presenter comments: What strong fellows our enforcers are!

Well, who will connect the text - the idealistic concept of the artist Chaparro - with the forceful exercises of the goons?

Former American Ambassador to Russia Michael McFaul (from 2012 to 2014) appears on the scene. Facing the artist Andres Chaparro, he delivers the following dialogues from his ambassadorial life, adding an evaluation in view of the events of the day: Kerry meeting Putin in Moscow⁵.

Through my conversations with students, I shall slow down somewhat your process of presenting American culture, which you have called, speaking as an aureolist (from the word aureole) "using the creative side of the brain".

The theme of the first dialogue: providing service for a convenient motivation to look into Putin's eyes with hope ...

The theme of the second dialogue:

I've compared taxpayer money with a barrel:

the one whose barrel will show its bottom sooner, loses.

The theme of the third dialogue: my lectures at the university on adapting taxpayers' money barrel for government through a tortured concept of a "bureaucrat".

The theme of the fourth dialogue:

finding out who's the Idiot (Dostoevsky), and who is Pierre Bezukhov (War and Peace) in Russia is impossible. All are jumping hopscotch - learning to maintain balance.

There is so much to gain and to be offered by thinking outside the box, exploring creative new ideas to problems, exploring ways to achieve inclusiveness, and yes how to effectively run a city with genuine concern & social consciousness and the best interest of its people over self interest.

I love you Hxxxford!

But a Lithuanian choir numbering many hundreds is storming the stage, and the choir is presented by the Lithuanian leader, President Dalia Grybauskaite.

The choir performs a song titled Putin the terrorist⁶

(Comment by a voice: spiritualism as a concept of fighting qualities - Lithuanian leader, President Dalia Grybauskaite. Love for Putin and terror)

Both leaders, both presidents are conducting: Putin and Dalia Grybauskaite.

On the stage, five huge curtains open and choir members appear in the background.

Then a dance area for two is formed at the center of the stage. Putin and Grybauskaite perform, first the Lithuanian folk dance Bitute Pilkoji, then a Russian quadrille.

Chaparro is preparing to perform a rap with his ensemble. The scene is expanded to its maximum size. Putin and Grybauskaite disappear from the scene: love sweeps away all barriers and on a cloud of love they fly upward.

On the stage, Secretary J. Kerry appears. He addresses the audience. He recites the injunction of President Obama to the next president of the USA, then leaves with his team for Brussels and then to work with the Syrian authorities on the creation of a new constitution.

Sergey Lavrov (pseudonym Grigol Ordzhonikidze) is at a loss: whether to be on stage and play again, finding a mate for himself, or get to Brussels ahead of the American delegation and then to go to Syria to reprimand and punish NKVD personnel left there after the withdrawal of military forces.

Whether to build military plants for the production of weapons in Syria, in the bombed-out areas or not, Putin has said nothing specific about that. Sergo is confused.

A painting by Chaparro appears on stage. An increased image of the picture occupies the perimeter of the scene with a small Sergo sitting at the bottom. The painting is "Sergo in confusion."

The audience leaving the hall disperses through the halls of the former Soviet Union countries. Which halls will be open today and whether they will be open, this is a secret of Sergo.

At the moment of meditation Morgan, Brown & Joy, LLP talk with S. Lavrov about transferring the US shipbuilding industry to Russia. Sergey Lavrov felt better and went to the nearest bar to have a beer (Sergey Davlatov)
